If the Alphaphonics™ does not turn on	Check that the batteries are installed correctly, or install new batteries.
If the volume is too low	Install new batteries
The sounds are abnormally quick or slow	Install new batteries
If there is a continuous buzzing sound	Install new batteries
If the light of the toy becomes dim	Install new batteries

How to change batteries

- 1. This product requires 3 x AAA (LRO3) 1.5V batteries.
- 2. The batteries supplied with the product are for store demonstration purposes only and we recommend that they are replaced after purchase.
- 3. Use a suitable screwdriver to remove the battery cover located on the rear of the Alphaphonics.
- 4. Remove the old batteries. Insert 3 x AAA batteries, ensuring the + and terminals match the markings on the inside of the compartment.
- 5. Fit the battery compartment cover and tighten the screw to secure (but do not over-tighten)

Important battery information

Batteries must be inserted or removed by an adult.

Do not mix battery types (for example, alkaline and zinc carbon), or old and new batteries.

Do not attempt to recharge non-rechargeable batteries, as they may leak or explode.

Batteries must be inserted with the correct polarity.
